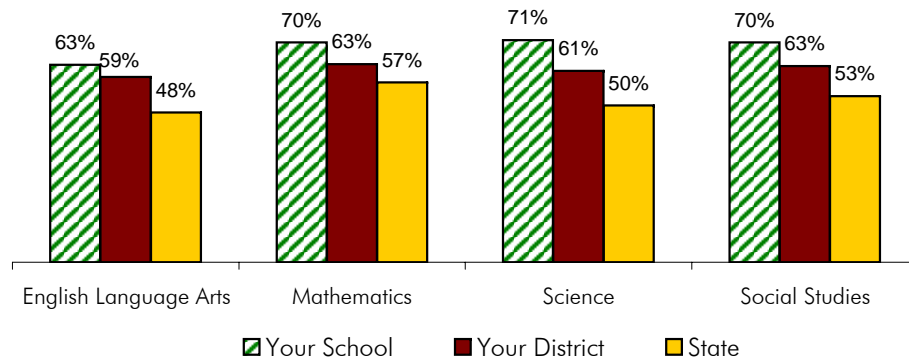


How Well Did Your Child's School Do on Each of the 4 SPS Parts?

Part 1: LEAP 21 (60% SPS Weight)

- Each student is placed at one of five achievement levels (*Advanced, Mastery, Basic, Approaching Basic, and Unsatisfactory*), based on his or her test results.
- The Percent Basic and Above is the percent of students scoring at the top three levels (*Advanced, Mastery, and Basic*).

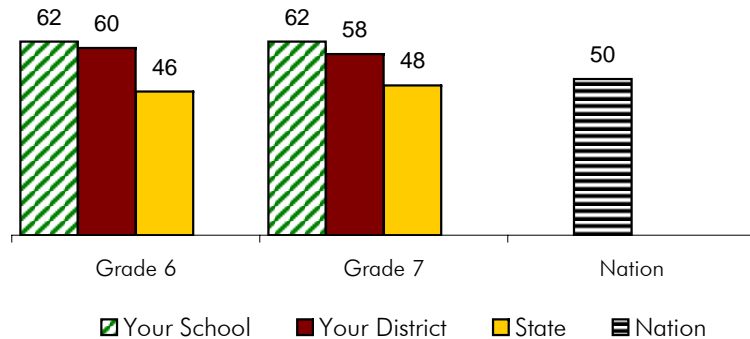
Spring 2004 Grade 8 LEAP 21 Test Results (Percent Basic and Above)



Part 2: The Iowa Tests (30% SPS Weight)

- The Iowa Tests show how well Louisiana students perform compared to students across the nation.
- The typical student in the nation performs at the 50th percentile.

Parts 3 and 4: Attendance and Dropout Rates (10% SPS Weight)

- Attendance and Dropout rates are based on prior year's data.
- For the dropout rate, a lower percentage is better.
