### task

**Task 1:** Listen to the conversation between the doctor who speaks Cajun French and Uncle Joe who speaks Canadian French. Help the doctor be sure he understands by drawing arrows on the worksheet that point to the body parts Uncle Joe mentions.

**Task 2:** Listen to the conversation between the doctor and uncle Joe again. This time check the parts of the body that hurt uncle Joe in the left column and draw a line connecting the cause of the pain to the ailing body part.

### materials

- cassette tape

 activation

The teacher enters the classroom complaining of numerous ailments and acts out gestures for each one to review previously learned song concerning parts of the body (têtes, épaules, genoux et pied - savez-vous planter les choux - Jacques a dit).


 information

Show the transparency of the chart of the human body. Point to the various body parts as they are mentioned on the tape. The second time you play the tape ask the students to point to the body part as it is mentioned.

**Cassette script:**

Dr. Ardoin: Bonjour, M. Lajoie. Comment ça va?  
 Oncle Joe: Pas trop bien. J'ai mal partout.  
 Dr. Ardoin: Partout? Mais où exactement  
 Oncle Joe: Bon. J'ai un gros mal de tête qui va me tuer!  
 Dr. Ardoin: Mal à la tête, c'est tout?  
 Oncle Joe: Non, j'ai aussi mal au ventre.  
 Dr. Ardoin: Vous avez de la fièvre?  
 Oncle Joe: C'est possible, mais je ne crois pas.  
 Dr. Ardoin: Vous avez mal à la gorge?  
 Oncle Joe: Non, pas du tout, mais, j'ai mal aux jambes.  
 Dr. Ardoin: Est-ce que j'ai quelque chose de grave, docteur?  
 Oncle Joe: Mais non, cher. D'abord, votre mal de tête, c'est l'humidité louisianaise. Le ventre, c'est sans doute la cuisine cadienne qui est assez pimentée. Voilà un médicament qui va vous aider.  
 Dr. Ardoin: Et mes jambes?  
 Oncle Joe: J'imagine que vous avez beaucoup marché pendant votre visite, oui? Vos jambes sont fatiguées! Allez chez vous et reposez-vous.  
 Dr. Ardoin: Merci, Docteur. Après le courir je vais me reposer.  
 Oncle Joe: Bonne chance - faites attention à ce que vous mangez ici en Louisiane!

**Task 1:** Instruct students to listen to the conversation between the doctor who speaks Cajun French and uncle Joe who speaks Canadian French. Students will then help the doctor make sure he understands by drawing arrows on the worksheet pointing to the part of the body Uncle Joe mentions as feeling bad.

**Task 2:** Remind the students to use the same worksheet and listen to the conversation between the doctor and uncle Joe again. This time they will check the parts of the body that hurt uncle Joe in the left column and also draw a line connecting the cause of the pain to the ailing body part.



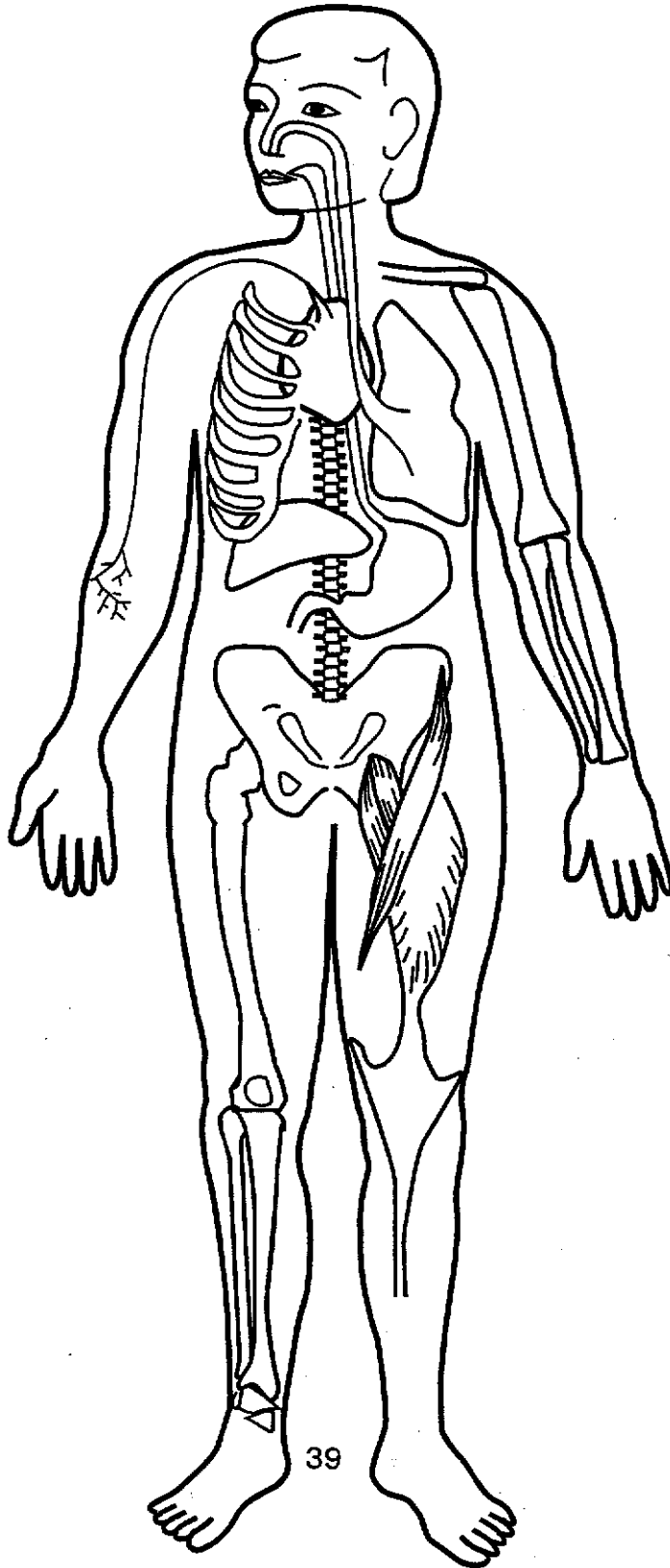
