

2005-2006 ACCOUNTABILITY SUMMARY RESULTS A USER GUIDE FOR THE STATE AND DISTRICT TABLE

The following **State and District Table** provides the number and percent of schools that did not make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP), schools that are in Academic Assistance (AA)/School Improvement (SI), schools assigned Growth Labels, schools eligible for rewards, schools assigned Performance Labels, and the total number of accountability schools (those receiving Performance Labels).

Schools that had severe impact from the hurricanes and chose to start over as new schools in accountability are waived from accountability for 2005-06. These schools are not included in the district or state numbers or percentages.

The Louisiana School, District, and State Accountability System has two components for Louisiana schools: the School Performance Score (SPS) Component and the Subgroup Component.

Column A: Row Headings – The first row provides the State of Louisiana summary results, whereas the remaining rows provide results for the 68 public school districts currently included in the accountability system. The State of Louisiana summary results also include data for public schools not included in the 68 school districts, including laboratory and Type 2 charter schools. The results for these schools are listed at the end of this report.

In addition to a **Total (All Schools)** row, the State and District summary results are subdivided into three different **School Types**:

Elementary/Middle Schools are schools with grades only in the K-9 range.

Combination Schools are schools with grades 10 and/or 11 and at least one grade in the K-7 range.

High Schools are schools with grades 10 and/or 11 that do not have grades outside of the 8-12 range.

The **Total (All Schools)** row depicts the total number of schools across all three types of schools.

Elementary, middle, and combination schools have been in accountability since the fall of 1999. High schools entered accountability in fall 2001.

The 2005-06 Growth SPS state average for all schools is 87.6. The 2005-06 Baseline SPS state average for all schools is 85.1.

Column B: This column indicates the number and percent of schools that **Did Not Make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP)** for the **SPS Component** and the **Subgroup Component**. A school failed to make AYP for the SPS Component if its 2005-06 Baseline SPS was below 60.0. A school failed to make AYP for the Subgroup Component if it did not meet requirements for test participation, academic performance, and an additional academic indicator (attendance rate or non-dropout rate). The denominator used to calculate the percent of schools not making AYP for the SPS component included all schools receiving a 2005-06 Baseline SPS. The denominator used with the Subgroup Component percentages included all schools with grades 3-8, and/or 10 that had the data required to evaluate the Subgroup Component. Closed schools were not included for either component's numbers and percentages.

Columns C through H: Academic Assistance (AA)/School Improvement (SI) – These columns indicate the number and percent of schools in each of the Academic Assistance/School Improvement levels. There are six levels of AA, levels one through six, and five levels of SI, two through six. Schools with a 2005-06 Baseline SPS between 60.0 and 119.9 that failed to make required growth are in AA. The first level of AA and all five levels of SI were assigned this year. The denominator used with the AA/SI percentages included all schools receiving a 2005-06 Baseline SPS. Closed schools were not included.

Columns I through N: Growth Information – The **Growth Label** describes the level of growth achieved by a school. The denominator used to calculate the Growth Label percentages included all schools that received a 2005-06 Growth SPS. Closed schools were included.

Column I: No Label Assigned shows the number and percent of schools that had no Growth Label assigned. These schools have a 2005-06 Baseline SPS of 105.0 or more, but they did not achieve their Growth Targets.

Column J: Exemplary Academic Growth was assigned to schools that met their Growth Targets, are not in School Improvement, and achieved Subgroup Performance Score (GPS) growth of 2.0 points or more for their applicable subgroups (five ethnicities, Limited English Proficient, Free/Reduced Price Lunch, and Students with Disabilities).

Column K: Recognized Academic Growth was assigned to schools that met their Growth Targets. These schools may be in School

Improvement and/or may not have achieved Subgroup Performance Score (GPS) growth of 2.0 points or more for each of their applicable subgroups listed above.

Column L: Minimal Academic Growth was assigned to schools that improved their SPS by at least 0.1 points but did not meet their Growth Targets.

Column M: No Growth was assigned to schools with a change in SPS of 0 to minus (-) 2.5 points.

Column N: School in Decline was assigned to schools with an SPS decline of more than 2.5 points.

Column O: Eligible for Rewards indicates the number and percent of schools eligible to receive a monetary reward. Schools had to have either the *Exemplary Academic Growth* or *Recognized Academic Growth* 2005-06 Growth Label to receive a reward. The denominator used to calculate the rewards percentages included all schools receiving a Growth Label. Closed schools were included.

Columns P through U: Performance Information – These columns contain the numbers and percentages of schools receiving each **Performance Label** in 2005-06. The denominator used to calculate the Performance Label percentages included all schools that received a 2005-06 Baseline SPS.

Column P: The **Five Stars** label was assigned to schools with a 2005-06 Baseline SPS of 140.0 or above.

Column Q: The **Four Stars** label was assigned to schools with a 2005-06 Baseline SPS of 120.0 to 139.9.

Column R: The **Three Stars** label was assigned to schools with a 2005-06 Baseline SPS of 100.0 to 119.9.

Column S: The **Two Stars** label was assigned to schools with a 2005-06 Baseline SPS of 80.0 to 99.9.

Column T: The **One Star** label was assigned to schools with a 2005-06 Baseline SPS of 60.0 to 79.9.

Column U: The **Academically Unacceptable School** label was assigned to schools with a 2005-06 Baseline SPS below 60.0.

Column V: The **Total Accountability Schools** is the number of schools receiving a 2005-06 Performance Label (or a 2005-06 Baseline SPS).
